**Location:** Situated in the center of tropical countries along the Gulf of Guinea (West Africa).

**Neighbouring States:** La Cote d'Ivoire (West), Togo (East). Burkina Faso (North). To the south is the Gulf of Guinea.

**Area:** 238,537km<sup>2</sup> (92,000sq miles) - about the size of Britain (244,015 km<sup>2</sup>).  
Form of Government: Constitutional Multiparty Democracy.

**Legal System:** Based on English Common Law and Customary Law.  
Independence: March 6, 1957 (from Britain).

**Population:** 18.8 million (2000 census). Annual Population Growth Rate: 3.0%

**Climates:** the climate, which is tropical, is divided into three zones-southern forest belt (warm and humid), coastal belt (warm and dry), and northern grasslands (hot and dry). The main rainy season occurs between April and October. It is dry and hot the rest of the year, November - March. Temperatures range from 22 C and 32 C. In the dry season these rise to 40 C and 42 C and in very extreme cases 45 C.

### **OTHER SERVICES**

**Electricity:** The electrical current in Ghana is 220 volts, 50 cycle.

**Medical Services:** Major medical hospitals are the Korle bu, 37 Military, the Police and the SSNIT hospitals.

**Postal Services:** Postal Services are available at GIMPA. Services at the Information Centre will include mail and public booths for international telephone, telex and facsimile.

**Banking and Currency:** Commercial banks operate from 0830 to 1400 hours: Monday - Thursday and 0830 to 1500 hours: on Fridays. The Ghanaian currency is the Cedi which is divided into 100 pesewas.

The Cedi equivalent of major international currencies is posted daily by the Bank of Ghana and the various Foreign Exchange Bureaux (Forex Bureaux).

**Telephones:** An international call from Accra is best placed by using either of these access codes: AT & T: Print:019900.

To place an international call to Accra, dial 233 (the international code for Ghana + 21 (the city code for Accra) + the number you wish to reach.

**Time:** Accra observes Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) and is five hours ahead of Eastern Standard Time in the United States. The sun rises at approximately 06:00 hours and sets at approximately 18:30 hours.

## **THE MEDIA IN GHANA**

- (a) **Print:** There are two main dailies, “The Daily Graphic” and “The Ghanaian Times”, several weeklies and many sports papers. These newspapers are available at news-stands in hotels and at street corners. International newspapers and magazines are also available at news-stands in major hotels and book shops.
- (b) **Electronic:** The Ghana Broadcasting Corporation operates two national radio networks and one television channel.
- (c) **Television Services -** GTV and Metro TV - operate during week days from 0500 to 0100 hours in the evening and at weekends and on public holidays. Ghana television transmission standard is PAL B 5VHF with 5 low power relays.

There are five television stations, TV.3, Metro TV, TV Africa, GTV in Accra; and Crystal TV in Kumasi.

## **HISTORICAL NOTES AND IMPORTANT DATES IN THE HISTORY OF CATHOLIC CHURCH IN GHANA**

## **THE GHANA CATHOLIC BISHOPS' CONFERENCE**

The Ghana Catholic Bishops' Conference, hereinafter referred to as the Bishops' Conference, is a religious organisation having its legal foundation in the Canon Law of the Catholic Church, which applies to all Catholic Churches of the Roman Rite throughout the world. The Bishops' Conference, according to the Canon Law of the Catholic Church (Canons 447-459), is the central body of the Church in Ghana. Its purpose is to deliberate on matters of concern to the Church in Ghana and to encourage activities in accordance with the needs of the times.

All the Bishops in Ghana are members of the Conference, which has a President and a Vice President. Their term of office is three years, but they can be re-appointed for a second term. The current President is Most Rev. Lucas Abadamloora, Bishop of Navrongo-Bolgatanga, while the Vice President is Most Rev. Gabriel Charles Palmer-Buckle, Archbishop of Accra.

The Bishops' Conference, in addition to Plenary Assemblies, has an Administrative Board to handle ordinary matters in between the Plenary Assemblies. The Administrative Board is made up of the President, the Vice President and one representative each of the four Provinces.

### **1. The Plenary Assembly**

The Bishops' Conference meets in Plenary twice in a year, i.e. May (when it receives reports from the various Departments of the Secretariat, Commissions and Chaplaincies, and approves the budget for the operation of the National Catholic Secretariat) and November (when it deliberates on matters of general concern and issues a Communiqué at the end of the session).

Representatives of the Conference of Major Superiors (Men and Women) are invited to the November Plenary Assembly to give reports on their activities and to take part in discussions but they may not vote. Similarly, resource persons are invited to address the Bishops on topical national and international issues.

### **2. The Administrative Board**

The Administrative Board is the Executive Organ of the Bishops' Conference. It meets twice in a year, i.e. February and August, to deal with matters which cannot wait for the Plenary Assembly.

## **THE NATIONAL CATHOLIC SECRETARIAT (NCS)**

The National Catholic Secretariat, which is the Executive Arm of the Bishops' Conference, was established in 1960 and was registered as a Corporate Body in 1962.

### **Mission Statement**

The Secretariat is to implement the decisions and policies of the Bishops' Conference through its Departments and Commissions for the spiritual and human development of the people of God.

The Secretariat is headed by a Secretary-General, assisted by an Assistant Secretary-General and other Administrative and Accounting Personnel.

The Secretary-General's Department co-ordinates the activities of the various departments to ensure that decisions and policies of the Bishops' Conference are effectively and efficiently carried out.

The following are the Departments and Commissions of the Secretariat.

- ★ Department of Education (with a section on Religious Education).
- ★ Department of Health (which includes the Catholic Drug Centre and the Production Pharmacy).
- ★ Department of Socio-Economic Development (which has a section for Migrants and Refugees, Justice and Peace).
- ★ Department of Social Communications (DEPSOCOM).
- ★ Department of Pastoral Care
- ★ Department of Clergy & Religious
- ★ Department of Ecumenical & Inter-Religious Relations.
- ★ Department of Juridical Matters
- ★ National Catholic Service Centre & Missionary Travels (NCSC/RAP-TIM)
- ★ Pontifical Mission Societies (PMS).
- ★ Theological Commission Catechetical Commission
- ★ Ethics Commission
- ★ Liturgical Commission

The roles of the various Departments are summarised as follows:

#### **DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION**

The General Manager of the Catholic Educational Unit acts as liaison between the Church and the Ministry of Education, the Ghana Education Service(GES) and other stakeholders in Education.

#### **RELIGIOUS EDUCATION SECTION OF THE DEPARTMENT OF EDUCATION**

From Jesus Christ, the Church received a clear and specific missionary mandate: "Go into the world and proclaim the Good News to the whole creation (Mk.

16:15). The Religious Education Section of the Department of Education of the National Catholic Secretariat exists to carry out this evangelising mission of the Church through the supervision, co-ordination and animation of pastoral-catechesis in Catholic Schools and Dioceses throughout Ghana, thus helping to lead people to active faith in Christ.

### **Mission**

The Mission of the Religious Education Section is the continuation of the mission of Jesus, the first and foremost evangeliser, through the promotion of Christian education in schools and on-going education in the faith in Dioceses throughout Ghana.

### **Role of the Secretariat**

In line with the tradition of the Church and in keeping with the Lord's command, our Bishops are conscious of the fact that their first task is to preach the Gospel of God to all people: In their effort to draw new disciples to Christ, they have to take note of the contemporary world in which they minister and also enlist experts to help them. To this end, they have set up a National Catechetical Commission, comprising catechetical experts with an explicit mandate:

- ★ To work together, collaborate and unify the total catechetical ministry in Ghana;
- ★ To propose, formulate and review, when necessary, guidelines on catechising and educating Ghanaians in the faith;
- ★ To encourage a unified response to the catechetical challenges without losing sight of the peculiarities of each Diocese;
- ★ To articulate dear directives regarding goals and practical means of implementing them together for the steady growth of the Church in Ghana;
- ★ To be alert on trends in Ghanaian society and initiate appropriate pastoral/catechetical response.

The Executive Secretary of Religious Education is the Executive Secretary of the National Catechetical Commission. He co-ordinates, implements and keeps the Commission alive and on course.

### **DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH**

The Department of Health serves as the Headquarters of the National Catholic Health Service (NCHS). It has two broad areas of service, i.e. Health Services

and Pharmaceutical Services. Its primary functions are as stated below. It is headed by an Executive Secretary and staffed by senior staff as heads of the respective Units.

The following are the functions of the Department of Health:

- ★ Advisory to the Ghana Catholic Bishops' Conference on all health matters;
- ★ Collaboration with other departments of the National Catholic Secretariat;
- ★ Liaison activities with respect to partners, both local and foreign, on behalf of the NCHS (MOH/GHS/CHAG/Donors/ Others);
- ★ Policy Development;
- ★ National Health Planning and Strategy Formulation;
- ★ Human Resource Development and Co-ordination; “  
Monitoring/Supervision/Evaluation of activities of the NCHS at all levels.

**Mission**

To provide high quality health care in the most effective/efficient and innovative manner, specific to the needs of the communities we serve and at all times acknowledge the dignity of the patient.

**Vision**

To continue Christ's healing ministry in bringing healing to the greatest possible number of people in the provision of total quality patient care through healers with good ethical and moral standards, who are conscientious as well as professionally competent, motivated and united in their common respect for fundamental human rights.

**Goals**

To provide and sustain health care services for the poor, neglected and marginalised segments of the society. The service will seek to empower the people it serves to take ownership of their own individual and collective needs.

**DEPARTMENT OF SOCIO-ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT (SED)**

The Department of Socio-Economic Development (SED - Caritas) of the National Catholic Secretariat was established in 1971 to co-ordinate and facili-

tate the socio-economic development efforts of the Catholic Church in Ghana. As a development arm of the Church, it is expected to contribute towards the achievement of the vision of the Bishops' Conference. SED works with the Diocesan Development Offices (DDOs) to address conditions of hunger, poverty and ignorance and human suffering due to emergencies.

**Mission:** SED/DDOs work to promote human dignity, social justice and peace by preferentially empowering the marginalised and the disadvantaged to improve their living conditions through participatory process.

**Development Focus of SED:** 1 The Department promotes self-help projects in agricultural development, micro-credit for micro-business. It also promotes women in development programmes and co-ordinates relief and logistics in times of emergencies. SED explores new areas to meet the challenges of the time. Such challenges include the promotion of self-help employment for products of Catholic Vocational Training Centres.

The Department is an affiliate of Caritas Internationalis and also works closely with Catholic funding organisations, as well as other NGOs and agencies

#### **DEPARTMENT OF SOCIAL COMMUNICATIONS (DEPSOCOM)**

The Department of Social Communications helps to co-ordinate the evangelisation apostolate through social communications. It acts as a liaison office with other organisations in the media and disseminates information about Church activities.

**Mission:** The Department of Social Communications of the National Catholic Secretariat was set up in 1960. It has a mission of promoting the gospel values of the message of Jesus Christ. This is carried out through the use of the media for effective and efficient evangelisation and for the integral development of humankind and society in general. DEPSOCOM liaises and collaborates with diocesan communications offices, communication agencies or institutions, government and nongovernmental organisations, among others, in fulfilling this mission.

#### **Vision**

The vision of DEPSOCOM is to promote the Catholic Church in Ghana and its activities for the promotion of Christian, social and human values through the means of social communications on the national and international levels.

The Department has the following sections: “ Press and Information

- ★ Radio/Television and
- ★ Audio-Visual and Group Media

#### **Press and Information Section**

The Press and Information Section of the Department receives, collates and sends out news of national character. This includes reports and decisions from the Bishops’ Conference and the NCS. It acts as a liaison between the Church on one hand and other public on the other. The Department publishes a newsletter known as NCS Newsletter. The Department also co-ordinates the Radio/Telephone Network of the Church. The Church has, through the DEPSOCOM, been able to get Catholic media practitioners both in the secular and Church media to form an association of media practitioners called Catholic Association of Media Practitioners-Ghana (CAMP-G).

#### **Radio/Telephone and Audio-Visuals**

Since the Church has no radio and television station of its own, its participation in this field is very limited. This Department serves on the Religious Advisory Committee of the Ghana Broadcasting Corporation. DEPSOCOM runs an audio and visual recording studio, and encourages the production of audio and video programmes in all the dioceses.

#### **Seminars/Workshops**

Seminars and Workshops on issues relating to communications are held from time to time on national and diocesan levels.

#### **Training**

Training of personnel to run the national and diocesan communications offices is one of the priorities of the Department. Stress is placed also on the need to provide on-going formation courses for Catholic presence in the secular media.

#### **World Communication Day Celebration**

The worldwide celebration is organised on national and diocesan levels on the theme given by the Holy Father through the Pontifical Council for Social Communications.

#### **Relations with International Catholic Media Organisations**

DEPSOCOM has close and regular contacts with the following international Catholic media organisations:

- ★ The Pontifical Council for Social Communications;
- ★ The International Catholic Union of the Press (UCIP);
- ★ International Association of Catholic Media (SIGNIS).

### **DEPARTMENT OF PASTORAL CARE**

The Department co-ordinates the pastoral work in the Universities, Hospitals, Security Services, etc. Also, the liturgy and, in particular, the inculturation of the liturgy is an integrarrious dioceses of Ghana. The main focus is on laity formation, the Youth, the Biblical Apostolate and on the Chaplaincies form a focal point for the Department.

The Department organises meetings of the Directors of Diocesan Pastoral Centres and Programmes.

It rails together the National Liturgical Commission twice a year and sets up training sessions to equip people for pastoral ministries. It also makes suggestions to the Bishops' Conference concerning pastoral issues.

### **THE DEPARTMENT OF CLERGY & RELIGIOUS**

The Department aims at:  
Facilitating and encouraging the need for regular and systematic ongoing formation for the Clergy and Religious for effective pastoral care at all levels - National, Provincial and Diocesan.

Identifying and proposing for the continuous formation of the Clergy and Religious issues of pastoral relevance and concern in our times.

Link between the Bishops' Conference and:

- i. The National Union of Ghana Catholic Diocesan Priests' Associations.
- ii. The Conference of Major Superiors of Religious Men.
- iii. The Conference of Major Superiors of Religious Women.
- iv. Vocations Directors Association.
- v. International movements, Associations and Societies of the Clergy and Religious.

- ★ Through the mixed commission which comprises representatives from Conferences of Religious Men and Women and that of the Bishops' Conference, undertake common ventures for the benefit of the Clergy and Religious.
- ★ Proposes to the Bishops' Conference the establishment of relevant structures to address the pastoral, spiritual, emotional and psychological and physical needs of Clergy and Religious.
- ★ Facilitates and promotes understanding and cooperation among the diocesan clergy and religious in order to eliminate suspicion and unhealthy competition.
- ★ Helps in the formulation and dissemination of policies of the Bishops' Conference for the Clergy and Religious.

#### **DEPARTMENT OF ECUMENICAL RELATIONS & INTER-RELIGIOUS DIALOGUE**

The Department aims at:

- ★ Formalising the already good relations between the Catholic Bishops' Conference and the Christian Council of Ghana (CCG) and its member churches;
- ★ Exploring and strengthening areas of co-operation between the Catholic Church and member churches of the CCG to the cause of Christ;
- ★ Making official information and releases available to each other so as to preclude the likelihood of misinterpretation and/or misunderstanding of each other's stand on certain sensitive issues;
- ★ Encouraging respect for other religions and enhances the need and process for inter-religious dialogue, in Ghana;
- ★ Organising study sessions on themes related to Islam, African Traditional Religion and Christianity to enhance religious tolerance and peaceful co-existence;
- ★ Production and dissemination of religious literature, in order to equip those in formation, seminarians, catechists, the religious and the laity.

## **DEPARTMENT OF JURIDICAL MATTERS**

### **Mission**

To create canonical awareness in all sectors of the Ecclesiastical community through formation, data analysis and publishing information gathered.

### **Vision**

A well-informed Church in matters canonical is a prerequisite for order, discipline and pastoral solidarity in all sectors of the ecclesial community in Ghana.

### **Aims:**

- ★ The formation of the Clergy, Religious and Laity on matters canonical;
- ★ To keep abreast with current canonical issues by correspondence with other Canon Law bodies;
- ★ To organise Ghana Canon Law Society and to liaise with the Catholic Lawyers' Guild;
- ★ To monitor the progress of the four Provincial Marriage Tribunals and to support ways of improving their efficiency;
- ★ Periodic publication of Acts from the Bishops' Conference matters canonical;
- ★ General consultation on matters canonical.
- ★ The Values of the Department:
- ★ To fight against ignorance of Church law;
- ★ Creation of canonical awareness at every level of Christian community;
- ★ Full co-operation in the execution of Church law between Religious Societies and Dioceses
- ★ Promotion of organic unity and solidarity within the dioceses;
- ★ Establishment of appropriate diocesan structures for smooth diocesan administration

## **THE NATIONAL CATHOLIC SERVICE CENTRE (NCSC)**

The NCSC handles import documentation with regard to tax and duty exemptions from the Government. The exemptions are limited to donations for educational, agricultural, health and socio-economic activities of the church. It facilitates the clearing of goods and other logistics for the mission and works of the Ghana Catholic Bishops' Conference (GCBC)

The Department also arranges for immigrant quota approval from the Ministry of Interior and the processing of residence permits for all expatriates working for the GCBC. The NCSC acquires passports, visas, tickets and other travel documents for members of the GCBC and people working for the Conference.

In sum, the Department deals with the Ministries of Trade and Presidential Initiatives; Finance and Economic Planning; Foreign Affairs; of the Interior; Ports; Harbour and Railways; Manpower; Development and Empowerment.

## **PONTIFICAL MISSION SOCIETY (PMS)**

The Pontifical Mission Societies is headed by a National Director. The role of the Pontifical Mission Society consists chiefly in animating a missionary awareness among Catholics in Ghana: The specific way of doing this is through the

- ★ Propagation of the Faith;
- ★ St. Peter the Apostle;
- ★ Pontifical Missionary Union;
- ★ Holy Childhood.

The Pontifical Mission Society is the liaison between the Bishops' Conference and the Pontifical Mission Societies in the Vatican City, Italy.

## **DEPARTMENT OF LAITY AND FAMILY**

The primary function of the National Catholic Laity Council is to:

- a) Collaborate with the hierarchy of the Church so as to assist Christ's faithful as members of organised communities or associations in their evangelisation apostolate;

- b) Plans, promotes and co-ordinates study, training and formation programmes for Christian leadership at the parish, diocesan and national levels;
- c) Acts as an effective and efficient mouthpiece for the transfer of information to and from the hierarchy of the Church.
